

Che Invisible Colours (Part One)



Like my previous works, these pieces are deeply rooted in nature. However, for this recent series, I chose to focus not on natural elements like tree trunks or flowers, but on the essence of color itself—its soul, rather than its physical form.

Color, at times, appears invisible to the eye or hides beneath the shadows cast by the body. In this project, my focus was solely on the color, independent of the objects that usually define it. We often define the appearance of nature at first glance, but here, I have removed the objects, leaving only the invisible colors that remain when form is stripped away.

Throughout the creative process, my aim was to reveal the beauty of color as a standalone entity. Not the beauty that is tied to shape, but the beauty of color as a pure symbol of form. By isolating color from its natural context, I invite the viewer to see beyond the appearance and experience the essence of nature in a more abstract, soulful way.


Che Invisible Colours






